
Story 17. Abraham's Servant Fulfills His Vow Genesis 24:29-54a

This narrative demonstrates not only the blessing of the Lord but Abraham's wisdom in sending his steward back to Haran to get a wife for Isaac. Although Abraham's family may not have the same relationship with the Lord as Abraham, they are far removed from the paganism and wickedness of the Canaanites. The words and actions of Abraham's steward testify to the impact Abraham's faith has had on his household. Both Rebekah and Laban will play an important role in the unfolding drama of God's chosen people. Rebekah's father Bethuel was the youngest son of Abraham's brother Nahor and his wife Milcah. And so the story continues.

Now Rebekah had a brother named Laban. When Laban saw the ring and the bracelets on his sister's arms and heard Rebekah's explanation, "This is what the man said to me," Laban ran out to the spring where the steward was standing by his camels. Laban said, "Please come in—you who are blessed of the Lord! Why are you standing here outside? I have prepared the house for you and the camels.



So Abraham's steward came into the house, unharnessed the camels, gave them straw and fed them. Water was brought so the steward and his men could wash their feet. Food was set before him so he could eat. But the

steward said, "I will not eat until I say what I have come to tell you." Laban said, "Please tell us."



So the steward began, "I am Abraham's servant. Jehovah has blessed my master greatly and Abraham has

be the woman that you Jehovah have chosen for my master's son."



"Before I had finished speaking in my heart—Rebekah came out with her water jar on her shoulder. She went down to the spring and filled her jar with water. I said to her, 'Please, may I have a drink?'







And she quickly took her jar from her shoulder and said, 'Drink, and I will draw water for your camels also." So I drank and she watered my camels. I asked her, 'Whose daughter are you?' She told me, 'I'm the daughter of Bethuel—the son of Milcah—the wife of Nahor." So I gave her the ring and the bracelets for her arms.

Then I bowed my head and worshiped and blessed Jehovah—the God of my master Abraham—who led me

down the right path—to get the daughter of my master's brother to be the wife of his son. (Remove)
