As the travellers approach Emmaus, Jesus indicates His intention of continuing on alone. But the disciples do not want their time to end. When Jesus and the two disciples came to the village of Emmaus where they were going, Jesus acted as though he would go farther. But they urged Him saying, “Stay with us. The sun is going down and the day is almost over.”
