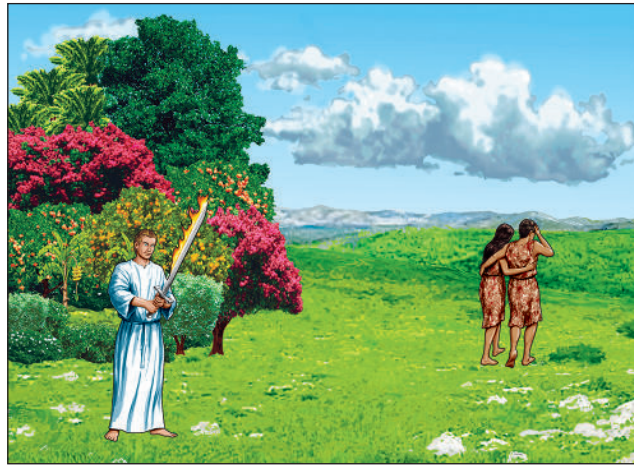


Story 2. Sin's Consequences and God's Salvation

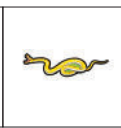

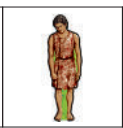

This story begins where the previous narrative ended and completes it. However, the damage from Satan's cunning and man's rebellion in the garden is just beginning. Actions and choices have consequences that often reach much further than expected. Mankind's rebellion not only affects the human family but even nature itself.

However, along with the sadness, God gives the couple hope. For it is in this story that God first reveals and demonstrates His plan for mankind's salvation and Satan's ultimate defeat. Amazingly, it is through the woman that Satan's crushing defeat will come!

Although there are severe consequences for Adam and Eve's rebellion, God shows them mercy and spares their lives. However, God had to be faithful to His Word. With a sweaty face you will eat bread—until you return to the ground, because you were taken from the ground. You are dust and you will return to dust.”
